Committee Officer Reports - 2018

President

The last year has been one of growth, success and celebration.

We started the year believing we were the biggest kayak club in New Zealand with somewhere around 440 members. Thanks to some improved reporting, along with an influx of members, we arrived at the end of the year with 545 members and counting. The Rasdex Classic River race grew in numbers from the previous year and we had to extend the club trailer to transport kayaks for the Club Team to attend Nationals at Lake Karapiro.

In December Arawa was presented with the Club of the Year Award at the CRNZ Awards event, for the second year running. In addition to this Bruce Johnston was presented with a CRNZ Service Award, recognizing the huge investment that Bruce has made to our sport through many years of service to Arawa and the Christchurch Community. Dayle MacKenzie's on-going contribution to the club was recognized with the CRNZ Volunteer of the Year award. In their respective fields of competition Arawa members excelled in a wide variety of events. Congratulations to you all for the dedication and hard work needed to succeed in your paddling disciplines.

To top off what was already a wonderful year, Arawa Canoe Club celebrated it's 50th Anniversary on the weekend before Easter. This was well supported by members, past and present, who shared memories and experiences of the development of the club over the years. It was fantastic to see all the surviving Life Members attend along with a significant number of past volunteers who contributed so much to making the club what it is today. A huge thank you to Brett Leask and the small team of volunteers who put together the events of the weekend.

Treasurer

Once again, the club has had a very successful year financially.

The operating profit has almost doubled going up from \$47,781 to \$88,650. The net profit (after depreciation has been taken into account) is even higher and has gone from \$32,863 to \$72,393 an increase of almost \$40,000.

These results have occurred due to a substantial increase in income against a relatively smaller increase in overall expenses.

Income has grown from \$142,518 to \$203,083. The main drivers of this increased income are as follows: membership income up from \$45,607 to \$61,269, race income up from \$18,396 to \$21,599, interest income up by just under \$3,000 and grants and sponsorship up from \$54,901 to \$74,897. It is interesting to note that grants received, dropped by just over \$4,000, but that donations and sponsorship increased by over \$23,000. Thank you very much to those very generous benefactors for their wonderful job in assisting the club.

Total expenses have increased from \$94,282 to \$113,789 with the largest increases relating to travel and accommodation.

The term deposit with the BNZ is now worth \$747,911. This figure has increased by over \$65,000 from last year and has come about from two sources. They are the compounding of the interest and the addition of surplus funds from our other club accounts. Hopefully when we finally rebuild, these funds will provide the bulk of our funding.

Once again, I would like to thank other the committee members for their help over the year with special thanks to Bruce and Michelle for the work they have done with the accounts.

As per last year, last but definitely not the least a big thank you to Craig Cox for performing his role as Club Auditor. He does this at no charge to the club and is yet another example of the generous support the club receives from the club's members and the community.

Coaching

Coaching at the club continues to be conducted on a voluntary basis. Last year our coaches ran over 1200 sessions on the water for paddlers of all abilities. The results of their efforts continue to be seen both in the achievements of our athletes, and the strong culture that is developing throughout the club.

Over the last few years, K1 coaching at the club has developed a solid structure beginning with a Tyro (U13) group. This progresses to an entry/intermediate level K1 group, and ultimately on to an advanced level where paddlers are approaching, or at international racing level. Over 1000 sessions were run last year by the four very dedicated coaches who operate in this area.

Despite ongoing attempts to recruit coaches to this area, multisport coaching at the club has struggled for volunteers who are able to regularly commit to sessions. In recent times this has meant that our multisport coaches have focused their efforts on running beginner sessions on Saturday mornings, and are leaving any further progression in terms of technique beyond that level to paddlers to arrange themselves with commercial operators. The club is initiating a Paddlers helping Paddlers page where members can offer their assistance for things such as coaching to others in the club on a more informal basis to also help to fill this shortfall. Weedies sessions continue as normal. Over the last year, the 13 volunteer multisport coaches have run around 200 sessions for club members.


Membership
